A LETTER FROM JOHN ALLEN 2019: A YEAR-ROUND FOCUS ON CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

he museum had a terrific year as we focused on enhancing our institutional commitment to fostering civic engagement. Our two new exhibits "Creating Camelot: The Kennedy Photography of Jacques Lowe" and "Robert F. Kennedy: Ripple of Hope" were well received by our visitors. Both exhibits conveyed messages relevant to current times as well as inspiration that reinvigorated the legacies of both President John F. Kennedy and Robert F. Kennedy. We are also very pleased with the success of the expanded Education programming and activities for youth across the Cape and Islands—details are noted in this newsletter.

Our focus for 2019 will provide continued momentum to the expansion of the relevancy and impact the museum provides to our visitors as well as to Cape Cod and Islands residents. For the first time, the Museum will be open year-round. From December 1 2018 through to mid-April 2019, the museum will be open Thursday through Saturday 10 am to 4 pm. ur Education Programs focus on civic engagement. Since January 2018, 2025 students, pre-kindergarten through high school, have participated in our classes. This winter we look forward to adding programming for adults.

Our first Cape and Islands High School event was Ambassadorship Day. We hosted sixty-seven students from fifteen high schools at the Museum. The focus was

pathways to leadership. Panelists included local elected and appointed officials, and MA elected representatives.

Representative Joseph P. Kennedy provided a compelling video keynote with a leadership message for the students.

The highlight of the fall season was our Candidates' Forum at Barnstable High School on September 21. Two hundred five high school seniors, eligible or soon eligible to vote, from ten Cape and Islands' high schools participated in a morning with all the Cape and Islands' Massachusetts Senator and Representative candidates.

The objective of the Forum was to facilitate students' active participation in the 2018 Midterm Election by providing direct communication on issues important to them, and to foster a deep understanding of their individual civic responsibility to vote.

Our keynote speaker was United States Congresswoman Niki Tsongas. She opened our program by sharing her professional experiences as a member of the House of Representatives. The students then had the opportunity to divide into groups by MA Representative precincts, where questions they submitted were posed to the candidates. Ann Quirk, Town Clerk, Barnstable, shared the voter-registration process and timeline with the students. The final part of our program was a forum for the MA Senate candidates moderated by Geoff Spillane, Cape Cod Media Group.

Student feedback was exceptional.

"It was good to see Representative Tsongas speak directly with a veteran who benefited from her efforts to supply the military with better armor." "The candidates gave surprising and outside-of-the-box answers to the questions asked. It introduced me to local politics, and informed my own opinions on local matters."

On behalf of the Museum, we would like to thank our sponsors and participants: Barnstable High School, Cape Cod Media Group, Cape Cod Young Professionals, Niki Tsongas, Ann Quirk, and all of the candidates. Their participation was integral to our

impactful program.

Our goal is to empower students to be civically engaged, embrace individual differences, listen closely, and dialogue respectfully. We have added lessons on the United States Constitution, pre-kindergarten through high school. Our curriculum is developed by outstanding Cape educators with the collaboration of our Education Committee. "Creating Camelot, The Kennedy Photography of Jacques Lowe," opened in May. The exhibit, on loan from the Newseum in Washington DC, features intimate behind the scenes images of John F. Kennedy, his wife Jacqueline, their daughter Caroline, and other family members taken between 1958 and 1961. This beautiful exhibit will remain in the Museum for the 2019 season.

"Robert F. Kennedy, A Ripple of Hope," opened in July. This beautiful inspirational exhibit, created in collaboration with the Robert F. Kennedy Human Rights Foundation, honors the 50th anniversary of his presidential campaign. His words continue to inspire us today, fifty years later.

Six outstanding speaker series programs allowed participants further insight into the life and legacy of the Kennedy family.



The season began with a presentation by Kerry Kennedy, sharing her book *Robert F. Kennedy, Ripples of Hope.* The book includes interviews with: Barack Obama, George Clooney, Gloria Steinem and others. Kerry shared that "it was a wonderful opportunity to spend time speaking to some of the leaders of our country and our world, who really made a difference, about how they view my father as their hero and how that's influenced their lives."

Eileen McNamara shared wonderful anecdotes about Eunice Kennedy Shriver from her book, *Eunice, the Kennedy Who Changed the World.*

We ended the summer with Robert F. Kennedy Jr., highlighting his book *American Values: Lessons I Learned from My Family.* He shared insight into growing up as a member of the Kennedy family. The biggest lesson he learned was the importance of social and environmental justice, ultimately becoming an environmental attorney.

Between Kerry and Robert Jr., we enjoyed presentations by Casey Sherman and Michael Tougias based on their book *Above and Beyond*, Gerard Doherty, *They Were My Friends – Jack*, *Bob, and Ted: My Life In and Out of Politics*, and we "went to the dogs" with Joan Lownds and Margaret Reed sharing their book *The Dogs of Camelot: Stories of the Kennedy Canines*. These presentations were done in collaboration with the Hyannis Public Library.
