MUSEUM PRESIDENT/CEO TO RETIRE

John L. Allen, President and CEO of the John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum, has announced that he will retire at the end of 2019.

"I have been honored and privileged to lead this extraordinary museum and its talented staff," says Allen, who turned 75 in February and discussed his retirement with foundation directors in the fall of 2018. Since then, he has shared his plans with museum staff, major donors, and friends of the museum. "During my career at the museum, I have had the pleasure of working with a dedicated board of directors and many individuals, businesses, and community partners who care about the vision and mission of the museum. Together, we have charted an exceptional course that will continue to serve the museum and the community."

Over a nearly seven-year period, Allen spearheaded an upgrade of exhibits and exhibit areas throughout the museum. He guided the expansion of cultural programming across the Cape and Islands, including the Summer Speaker Series, which features notable authors, public servants, and influential dignitaries. Allen launched efforts to modernize the building, such as renovating space on the second floor to create the Scudder Family Community Room—slated for completion in April 2020. The remodeled area will serve the museum's growing educational and cultural programming needs.

The museum is the fourth major attraction on the Cape, with an average of 70,000 annual visitors from the U.S. and around the world. Allen led the growth of the museum's civic education programs and youth activities, serving pre-K through high school. Last year, 2,400 Cape and Islands youth participated in museum-related educational activities designed to teach the value of civic engagement.

Peter Ubertaccio, Chairman of the Board of The John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum Foundation in Hyannis, expressed his admiration for Allen's strong vision and meaningful work with the community—sentiments shared by the board. Under Allen's leadership, the museum has consistently achieved excellent financial performance. "Thanks to John's leadership, the museum is poised for someone to advance it to the next level."

A succession committee was established by the board to search for the museum's next president. The formal search was launched in April. It is anticipated the committee will complete its work in the third quarter of 2019. During this transition period, Allen will remain involved in the museum.

"CAPE COD REMEMBERS JFK JR." OPENING JUNE 2019

Born two weeks after his father was elected President of the United States, John F. Kennedy Jr. grew up in the spotlight. At Hyannis Port on Cape Cod, at the White House during his father's presidency, and years later in Manhattan, JFK Jr. captivated the world.

John, his wife, and her sister all died in a plane crash off Cape Cod on July 16, 1999. As his beloved uncle Ted Kennedy said at his funeral, "From the first day of his life, John seemed to belong not only to our family but to the American Family."

John also belonged to the Cape Cod family. It was here that he enchanted us as a little boy and later beguiled us as an adult visiting the family home in Hyannis Port. He felt comfortable on the Cape walking down Main Street, Hyannis, and sometimes visiting the John F. Kennedy Hyannis Museum.

Set in thematic arrangements, "Cape Cod Remembers JFK Jr." features extraordinary images (some seldom seen) of John Jr. alone, or with his father, mother, sister, and wife. Through video, photographs, quotes, text, and artifacts, this commemorative special exhibit invites visitors to remember John F. Kennedy Jr., who, like his father, had every gift but length of years.

WITH GRATITUDE: THE JFK HYANNIS MUSEUM HONORS ROBERT LUDDINGTON

Mr. Robert Luddington is a tremendous friend to the JFK Hyannis Museum, not only donating his time by giving lectures across Cape Cod but also donating his wide collection of letters and memoranda from the Kennedy family to the museum to be used in future exhibits and research programs. Mr. Luddington also donated a \$2500 scholarship to the museum for 2019.

Mr. Luddington worked with the entire Kennedy family for 60 years, serving as an interior designer on multiple homes for the family's matriarch, Rose Kennedy, and later for her children and grandchildren. Stretching across the decades of his service as an advisor and confidante to the family, he is known by all members of the Kennedy clan simply as "Mr. Luddington."

Mr. Luddington was honored on May 29, 2019, at the 50th anniversary of Rose Kennedy's donation of the first Kennedy family home at 83 Beale Street, Brookline, to the National Park Service.
