A Place to Remember...



With the election of John F. Kennedy in 1960, there was an increasing demand to view the homes in the Kennedy Compound. This situation encouraged brothers Richard and Robert Scudder to enter the marine sightseeing business from a parcel of land at the "north end" of the Ocean Street Docks. Sixty years later, their family made possible the renovation of the second floor of the museum into a modern and flexible space for community gatherings and museum programs. The foundation has named this new space *The Scudder Family Center for Civic Engagement* with the intent to grow leadership education and host other events.



The Great Seal of the United States

Members of the JFK Memorial Committee in the Town of Barnstable accepted a gift of the resin master for the great seal of the United States which was installed on the memorial wall in Hyannis in 1966. The seal master was presented by Vanessa Hoheb, the daughter of its maker, Bruce Hoheb, an American sculptor (1930-1997). As a young girl, she helped her father with some elements of the design. The seal master is now in the care of the museum.

Blue Star Museums

Card to Culture program



We are proud to partner with Mass Cultural Council and Mass Dept. of Transitional Assistance, the Women,

Infants and Children's Nutrition Program and the Mass Health Connector to offer the Card to Culture program, the most comprehensive effort of its kind in the nation to open doors to arts and culture experiences for low-income families. The Card to Culture lets EBT, WIC and ConnectorCare cardholders experience the museum exhibits for free.

Discounted rates for U.S. veterans, school groups and group travelers from around the globe are also offered.
